#### **School Message**

This week I have been busy ordering furniture for the new building. It has given me the opportunity to reflect on how fortunate we are to have such fabulous facilities for our community. So many colleagues are to coping with peeling paint, cracked plaster, plumbing and electrical issues with no money to rectify the problems. When in Kenya teaching ten years ago the children worked in conditions that meant they got wet and muddy when it rained, as classrooms did not have floors or windows and burnt in the heat when it was assembly as this took place outside. Today I have had a Headteacher from Australia visiting and she has been overwhelmed by our facilities and the fabulous attitudes of the children. We are indeed fortunate but the funding crisis continues to affect us and maintaining our level of resourcing becomes more and more of a challenge. We do not want our school to fall into disrepair over the coming years but the reality is that, without increased government funding, we will. Next year is going to be a difficult year financially, we will be able to balance the books but only through being very careful. On Tuesday I will be speaking with others including local MPs at an event at Twerton Infants at 7pm which has been organised by parents who are fighting for more funding for schools. All parents from across BANES are invited and it would be great if some of our parents were there. If you cannot make it but would like to know more please speak to me and I will be able to put you in touch with the group.

Today's mother's day services have been lovely – it was great to see so many of you there, the children obviously enjoyed celebrating their Mums! I hope all of our Mums, Nans, Grandmas and Carers all have a lovely day on Sunday.

Next Friday is our Easter Bonnet Parade, everyone is invited to the parade which will start at 9am

I look forward to seeing you all at BINGO on Monday evening – eyes down at 5:30 pm!


