Dear Parents,

Online Classrooms—A message from Mr Low

I am extremely pleased that so many of you managed to join us this week for our online classrooms in Years 5 and 6. It's been fantastic! We have all had to move very quickly with technology that we are not used to and it would be fair to say that there have been a few tricky ICT problems to sort out. However, the main thing is that the children have got to see each other again and are starting to access more formal learning online. I have loved seeing the smiles on their faces when they first see their friends appear on the screen. Throughout the lockdown we have endeavoured to do all we can to support the children with their learning and well-being, and we will continue to be as innovative as we can to reach as many children as possible before the end of the term. However, there are a few things that parents need to consider:

- Most of the problems we've encountered have been with the technology children use in their own homes and it is very tricky for us to help you to solve these issues from a distance. If disruption to schooling looks likely to continue into the near future, parents may wish to look at how they can improve their child's access to online learning e.g. good internet connections, suitable devices etc.
- Online teaching can never replace being in a real classroom it's very different! So children will
 need to be more patient and there is a greater onus on them helping themselves and having less
 support.
- So far in the online classrooms, the teachers have been able to just focus on the children at home. But as more children return to school, we may have to combine class based lessons with online lessons, and these will look very different.
- We take E-Safety very seriously at St Nicholas, so please take time to speak to your child about appropriate use of this new technology and how to stay safe while online.

Next week, we will look to see if we can also get Years 3 & 4 into an Online Classroom. We will send a text message to parents when we are ready to test it but please be patient as it takes time to help everybody get set up.

School Uniform

Children will be expected to return in FULL school uniform in September.
